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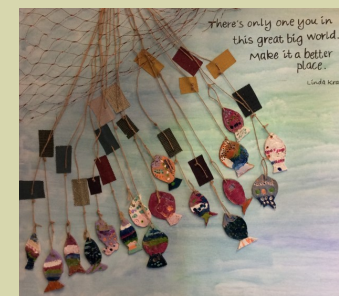

Our Core Christian Values:

Church schools have Christian beliefs and values at their heart. This means that every child and adult associated with the school is not important because they are members of the school but also because they are seen as unique individuals within God's creation.

We recognise that as well as children's cognitive, emotional and social development human beings have spiritual needs.



The spiritual aspects of life are therefore recognised at Galampton Primary School and nurtured alongside other development ('mind, body and spirit').

We therefore offer a spiritual dimension to the lives of children and their families, within the traditions of the Church of England.

At Galampton Primary School our Ethos and Christian values are encapsulated through our five gateways. The gateways are our guiding principles and are at the heart of all that we do. All of our gateways are underpinned by bible stories and children are taught how these bible stories can help them lead a good and full life as caring citizens.

Worship

While a shared Christian ethos permeates all our teaching and learning, a particular area of important to us as a Church School is Collective Worship.

There is a **daily act of Collective Worship**, which is a highly valued part of each school day. Although we say **prayers** at other parts of the day we come together either as a class, Key Stage or whole school to reflect, to wonder, to pray and sing.



Worships are led by the Head, staff, the children, visitors and the clergy. It is an opportunity for the children to learn about God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit and to understand the teachings of the Bible. In our acts of Worship, Bible teachings are related to the school's values and to the daily lives of the children.

Each half term we focus on a different Christian value. This is introduced on a Mondays, followed up in class worships, where certificates are given to children who have most demonstrated the week's value.
