Staffing for 2023/2024

We are delighted to announce that Miss Francesca Sharman will take up the position of full time Y1 Teacher from September. Miss Sharman is currently working at Brixham C of E Primary School, she knows our curriculum well and has already started her induction process at Galmpton.

All current teachers, apart from Mrs Paskin, remain in the same year group next academic year, but there are a few changes to notify you of.

Mrs Paskin will move to our EYFS class for two days a week and join Mrs Page, who leads on EYFS across our ACE Trust. Mrs Page will also become a Senior Leader at Galmpton, taking on Mrs Butler's previous role as EYFS/KS1 Lead.

Mrs Paskin will also work for one day a week in Year 3, as Mr Hicks joins the Leadership team as KS2 Lead and continues his role as Early Career Teaching Lead across the Trust.

Galmpton celebrated National Numeracy Day on Wednesday 17th May.


Parents were invited into school for an overview of our aims for the teaching of mathematics, the key concepts that we teach children in maths from Reception to Year 6 and ideas to try to support children's learning of mathematics at home.

After the presentation, parents had the opportunity to join their child for a maths lesson in class so see what maths looks like in action in school. It was lovely to see the parents and the children working together solving problems and enjoying their maths lessons together.









Thank you to all those parents who came and took part in our open morning event. The feedback from the session was overwhelmingly positive and parents clearly liked being back in the classroom. A key aspect to learning maths is confidence, knowing that you are learning even if you make a mistake – it was nice to see some of you telling me that you will be calling yourselves mathematicians from now on!

Our maths event continued after the parents had left us for the morning and children used their reading lesson to find out about a famous mathematician. In our Act of Worship at the end of the day, children shared their learning with the rest of the school.
