






Y1 Golden Hind Trip

Torre Abbey Visit

We were able to work inside the Barn itself and see what it would have been like for the 397 Spanish prisoners who were kept there during the Spanish Armada invasion. We were also given the opportunity to look around the Abbey and to explore how this had changed over 800 years.

Civic Award

Congratulations to the twelve year 6's who have completed their Torbay & Devon Civic Award, an award that requires a great deal of determination and independence.

To achieve the award, pupils have had to prove participation in the following seven areas:

- Active Citizenship in their school community, including positions of responsibility bringing positive change in the school.
- Active Citizenship in their home communities, such as beach cleans, bulb planting, helping at Brownies /Cubs/sports clubs and looking after people in the community.
- A physical hobby, which creates a sweat.
- A non-physical hobby, which really interests them.

• Residential experience and adventure training which entails sleeping away from home

and taking part in outdoor challenges.

 Adopt a cause or charity, which they feel strongly about. This includes researching it and finding ways of supporting it.

• Pledge to the planet – a promise that will contribute to the sustainability of our planet.

The children must also pass a rigorous assessment when they have to present all this evidence to an external assessor.

These children have worked so hard to achieve this award and I am immensely proud of all of them.
