We are currently planning a **brand new After School Club** to run from 3.15 to 5.30pm (in the first instance) from Monday to Friday. We are incredibly grateful to **Smartiezone** for the contribution they have made over the last couple of years and thank them for the work they have done. However, we now feel ready to run our own club.

Over the next few weeks we will be sending out more information and asking parents to sign up for sessions from September.

There will be a range of fun play-based activities, including: Physical Activity (e.g. organised ball games, use of play equipment, skipping ropes etc), arts and crafts, team games / board games / computer games, quiet reading etc and each Friday is Friday Film night - age appropriate ('U') films. (There will also be the opportunity to complete homework tasks!)

A range of snacks will be available for children attending the club. Healthy eating guidelines will be followed and includes wraps or sandwiches with cheese or meat, pasta & sauce, noodles, scones, crackers, vegetables and fruit. Two adults will run the club and we will take a maximum of 20 children. We are currently making arrangements to appoint after school club leaders.

**Cost:** The cost will be £8:50 per child per session. This is a standard charge per session irrelevant of time of pick up (between the end of school and 5.30pm). If your child attends another after school club, we can pick them up when this is finished. However, full payment for the session will still be required. We are more than happy to answer any queries you have by either popping into the school office or by contacting team leaders or Mrs Burns. If you are interested in helping to run the club, please contact Mrs Burns.

WE ARE A "NUT AWARE" SCHOOL

Due to a number of children who suffer severe nut allergies, we are highlighting and asking staff, pupils and parents for their help in minimising the risk to these children ....

Please avoid giving your child/ren nuts or nut products in their packed lunches.

Avoid giving nuts or nut products or snacks / bars containing nuts, for break time snacks.

Avoid supplying the school or FROGs (school PTA) with cakes or food items containing nuts for birthday celebrations / cake sales or events.

Avoid sending containers, such as cereal boxes, for art lessons into school which may have contained produce made with nuts

We do acknowledge that many foods are labelled as "may have been produced in a factory handling nuts and cannot be guaranteed to be nut free". Such items will be allowed in school as it would be unreasonable to expect these to be kept out of school.
