If you're unable to make the sessions and would like to talk to me about learning at Galmpton, my door is always open and I'm always happy to respond to any queries you have.



CAP Assembly Child Assault Prevention 24th February

It is recommended that the Assembly should take place approximately 12-18 months after the full project has been implemented in a school.

- Saying NO
- Peer Support
- Self defence/safe distance/the Yell
- Internet Safety
- Safe and Unsafe touches/secrets
- Trusted Adults/Keep on telling until you get help
- Childline
