Dear Parents

I think we're all very glad that the lighter mornings and evenings are now heading our way! We're very much looking forward to Spring 2: the warmer days and new growth.

I thought I'd take the opportunity in this newsletter to talk a little about our curriculum. We are exceptionally proud of the curriculum we have developed over the last few years and continue to look at innovative and creative ways to ensure children's learning is dynamic, interesting and impactful.

We believe that through the delivery of our three ACE principles: character education, metacognition (learning to learn) alongside academic subject knowledge and skills, we are able to ensure all our children are achieving the outcomes below.

Whatever subject the children are working on, we will be looking at a value. This half term, our values has been determination. Next half term our value is confidence. We know focusing on a character value or trait undoubtedly makes a difference to children's learning, so do ask your child about this.

At the same time we teach the children how to know themselves better as learners. This is called metacognition. The children frequently reflect on their learning and use a range of thinking tools to support and develop their learning. Next half term we will also be focusing on the children's ability to learn independently, so perhaps you could continue this work at home too. At our next parents meetings in March (dates on the last page), I will hold a workshop about our curriculum, so if you'd like to know more about our unique curriculum, do come along. The session added an extra layer of knowledge and consolidated their learning - it was a great way to end our learning enquiry 'How do leaders reflect determination. A case study of Dunkirk, 1940.'

#### History Visitor: Talking about 'Endeavour' one of the little ships

Peter came in to talk to us on Friday afternoon about one of the 'little ships' involved in the evacuation – 'Endeavour'. We found out lots of information and looked at further sources of evidence (primary and secondary) and heard about stories of determination from Peter's trips to recreate the evacuation in 2005 and 2010.

**Attendance Matters** 



Each month reports are generated on attendance and letters are regularly sent to families relating to any low attendance.

Please do be aware that the Local Authority can see each and every child's attendance at each school. We follow LA guidance and our own attendance policy and will refer relevant information to the Council for them to raise penalty notices if the threshold of 10 unauthorised absences have been met (5 days).

Please submit any absence requests to the office for consideration for each date your child will be absent from school - we need to be informed of all absences including funerals, weddings, dance exams etc. as well as holiday's.

It is the school's responsibility to account for each and every absence in term time and we are reliant on your assistance with this. If there is any doubt whatsoever about absence, enquiries will be made directly to the parent/carer and some form of evidence for absence may be requested - this is always the case if school is notified of absence due to illness prior to or following holiday absence.

If the threshold for a penalty notice has been met, all relevant information is then sent to the LA for a decision on whether they will proceed with a penalty notice. Surprisingly we have referred information to the Council for 11 penalty notices so far this academic year.

We would take this opportunity to remind you that we have scheduled non-pupil dates to fall straight after the Summer half term holidays. These dates may make holidays more accessible to our families.
